What's in a name?

Our names are pretty important. They are the first thing we generally share with new people and strangers. "Hello, my name is..." We use names when we greet old friends and family. It's no won-

der that name tags have never gone out of style - because we know that knowing and using names is a powerful reminder of who we are and something that builds up a community. I know as the new pastor at Wittenberg, I've got my work cut out for me to start the important work of linking faces with names!

Not only do names help bring communities together, names can hold and express powerful meanings and memories. Certainly famous last names like Washington, Bush, Clinton, Luther automatically invoke strong emotions and experiences in us! Or when we share together the names of loved ones who have died, like Aunt Mildred, or Grandpa Tim, it warms our hearts to remember and bring alive those who are no longer with us in flesh and bone.

When we think about what's in a name as Christian sisters and brothers, though, things become radically different than the ways of the wider world. Jesus throws the importance of family names and bloodlines out the window in Mark 3:33-35, when he asks, "Who are my mother and my brothers? Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." And while that might disorient and alarm us, Jesus makes room for an even more meaningful understanding of names and the power that they hold. Because beyond the club and membership cards that we carry in our purses and wallets (or even our birth certificates!), with our names printed upon them, we are first and foremost named as Children of God. Our identity - who we are – is shaped first and foremost by the relationship in and with Jesus Christ, the Son of God. No wonder we use our first names with Jesus' when we baptize at the font, or when we affirm the gift of the Holy Spirit in our youth when hands are laid upon their heads and hear their name being prayed aloud at their confirmation!

And while the good news that we are Children of God might sound like pretty old news for some of us, we must always remember that unlike being named as Bates, or Luther, or Washington, but instead we are linked to the great and universal family name of Christ, which alters our identity, life, and world in amazing and unbelievable ways! God gives God's name
